

Full Text Paper Preparation

The rules for preparing a full text paper are stated below.

PAPERS THAT DO NOT COMPLY WITH THE RULES WILL NOT BE PUBLISHED AS FULL TEXT.

If accepted, the studies of those who answer "yes" to the relevant publication question during abstract submission will be published as full texts. For those who answer "no", only the abstract will be published.

Word Count: Excluding abstract, references, figures, images, graphics, and tables, the full text must not exceed **1500 words**.

ABSTRACT

Researchers who will submit full text papers must upload both Turkish and English abstracts to the online abstract submission system in accordance with the abstract submission guidelines. Full text papers should not include an additional cover page containing abstract, author names, or institution information.

The following sections must be included in the full text paper:

1. INTRODUCTION

Information about the background of the topic and its place in current literature should be provided. This section should answer the question of why the research was conducted. The aim and hypothesis of the study must be clearly stated in the final paragraph of the introduction.

2. MATERIALS AND METHODS

This section should define the materials used in the study, provide detailed information on sample collection, storage, and evaluation processes, and explain the methods applied using short and clear sentences in a logical flow. The method used to calculate the sample size should be stated.

Statistical methods and data analysis techniques applied should also be presented.

3. RESULTS

The findings of the research should be presented clearly, concisely, and understandably. A maximum of 5 tables, figures, or graphs may be included.

4. DISCUSSION

Without repeating the introduction, this section should emphasize the significance of the findings in the context of the literature. The findings should be discussed with reference to the current literature.

5. CONCLUSION

This section should reflect the researcher's own interpretation based on the findings. The implications of the findings for future studies should be mentioned.

6. REFERENCES

A maximum of 15 references should be used. References should be numbered in parentheses in the order in which they appear in the text and listed accordingly at the end. The reference list should be placed on a separate page within the same document.

If there are five or fewer authors, all names should be listed. If there are more than five, list the first five followed by "et al."

The citation format must comply with the latest version of the "Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals" (<http://www.icmje.org>).

Journals: Author name(s), article title, journal name (should be abbreviated according to the "Index Medicus" list), year, volume number, first and last page numbers.

(Example: Shannon KR, Nanda RS. Changes in the curve of Spee with treatment and at 2 years posttreatment. Am J Orthod Dentofacial Orthop 2004; 125: 589-596)

Books: Name(s) of the chapter author(s), book title, edition number, place of publication, publisher, year.

(Example: Graber TM, Rakosi T, Petrovic AG. Dentofacial orthopedics with functional appliances. 2nd ed., St. Louis, Mosby; 1997)

Book Chapters: Chapter author(s), title of the chapter, editor(s), book title, place of publication, publisher, year, first and last page numbers.

(Example: Marsh PD, Nyvad B. The oral microflora and biofilms on teeth. In: Fejerskov O, Kidd E, editors. Dental caries the disease and its clinical management. 2nd ed. Blackwell Munksgaard; 2004. p. 29-48)

TABLES

Tables should be numbered with Arabic numerals according to the order in which they appear in the article. Their positions should also be indicated within the text. Tables must be placed after the references on the last page of the Word document, and each should have a separate title. Tables should be self-explanatory and must not duplicate the content of the text.

If previously published information or tables are used, the original source must be cited in a footnote placed beneath the table.

(Example: "Table 1: Demographic data")

ABBREVIATIONS

Abbreviations should be defined in parentheses the first time they appear in the text and must be used consistently throughout the manuscript.

FIGURE AND IMAGE CAPTIONS

Figures and images should be saved in JPEG or TIFF format with a resolution of 300 dpi. For histological images, the magnification and staining technique must be indicated. Additionally, all figures/images must be inserted after the references and tables on the last page of the Word document, and each figure/image must include a caption.

Figures and images should be numbered in the order in which they appear in the text, and their positions should also be indicated in the manuscript. Captions must be short, not repetitive, and should be informative. Any abbreviations used in the images/figures must be clearly explained.

(Example: Figure 1: Pre-treatment clinical view. Diagram 1: Flow chart of the study. Graph 1: Gingival crevicular fluid volume (μ l).)

Colgate Scientific Research Award Application Guidelines

The Colgate Scientific Research Award is valid only for oral presentations.

- The research must be original, and it must not have been previously presented at any other scientific meeting or published in any scientific journal. If a study is unpublished at the time of application but is published before the congress date, the author is required to contact the organization and withdraw their work from the competition.
- Individuals holding the title of Associate Professor (Doçent) or Professor are not eligible to be presenters in the Colgate Scientific Research Award.
- The presenter must be a member of the Turkish Society of Periodontology and must have completed congress registration.
- Applicants must select the Colgate Award application option in the online abstract submission system.
- A Word document prepared in accordance with the full-text guidelines must be uploaded to the designated section in the online system.
- Research that does not meet the oral presentation criteria or fails the preliminary selection process will still be accepted as an oral presentation, but not considered for the award.
- A minimum of 10 applications is required for the Colgate Scientific Research Award to be granted.
